- **Barriers for safe and affordable housing were discussed:**
 - Affordable housing usually requires the applicant to pass a background check.
 - Many builders aren't interested in building low income housing because the paperwork is tedious, competitive, and there is more profit to be made in building luxury homes.
 - There is a gap in services for programs that provide housing assistance – in many cases, once a participant finds a job they are no longer qualified for housing assistance, but don't make enough to afford housing on their own.
- **Opportunities and best practices were also discussed:**
 - There is a significant need for rehab housing in the Upstate.
 - A common intake process can streamline access to services.
 - Affordability and inventory are key
